

Safeguarding Children and Young People



Target Audience

Staff working in a variety settings and who work with or come into contact with children and young People. The aim of this course is to ensure all staff attending will gain the knowledge required to be able to ensure that every child can be safeguarded and protected from harm.

This course has been developed for learners whose job role requires them to have contact with Children and Young People within their own work setting, this may be face to face, virtual or on the phone. Risks of abuse and harm can be presented in a wide variety of ways and this course will support learners to explore and acknowledge how to identify potential risks and how to ensure these are reported.

This course is delivered using a range of methods and resources including:

 Live tutor facilitation, interactive polls, questionnaires and drawing tools, scenarios for breakout groups, questioning and participation, video, current news articles, policies and procedures and end of session assessment.
