Angelman syndrome is a genetic disorder that affects the nervous system and causes severe physical and intellectual disability. Support and care needs will be lifelong and can be therefore impacted by general ageing and other conditions.

Face to face tutor facilitation, questionnaires, fact sheets and scenarios for research and breakout groups, questioning and participation and an end of session assessment
